INTRODUCTION

Thank you for choosing School Datebooks. This print-ready handbook preparation and submission manual explains the setup and submission process. For best results, follow these guidelines and submit file as a PDF. Our Full Color Signature Series product supports **BLEEDS**. If you'd like to take advantage of bleeds in your handbook, please refer to the specifications and guidelines on pages 2 and 4. Contact your Account Manager if you have any questions or concerns regarding this process.

PREPARING YOUR PRINT-READY FILES

- It is very important to use the correct page setup when submitting your text for print (see pages 2-3).
- Online templates are available, based on the size of the book you have ordered. For Microsoft Word templates, go to
 <u>www.schooldatebooks.com</u> and click "Resources". Adobe InDesign templates are also available; to find out more, please
 contact your Account Manager at 800.705.7526.

PROOFING YOUR HANDBOOK

- PROOFING YOUR HANDBOOK IS ESSENTIAL.
- Proof it once, twice, and a third time. We recommend having different people review and get "fresh eyes" on the layout.
- WYSIWYG What You See Is What You Get! If it's on the layout you send to us, it will be in your handbook.
- Make sure any dates and years are correct and reflective of the upcoming school year.

SUBMITTING INFORMATION

- We prefer PDF files for print-ready information. However, if you prefer to send us native files, be sure to PACKAGE your InDesign files to include fonts, images, and any additional files. These can be submitted as a .ZIP or other compressed format to ensure all files are uploaded.
- Login to the Zone[™] to upload your print-ready handbook and any other book-related materials. Your order confirmation email included a link to your Zone site.
- Upload your handbook by selecting **Start Handbook** under your order for this year, or click on the 'Handbook' icon. Follow the steps to upload all of your files and submit them to School Datebooks.
 - Once your files are submitted, School Datebooks will generate a proof. You will then have an opportunity to make sure everything is appearing as expected, and select any filler pages needed to fill out your contracted page count.

PRINT-READY HANDBOOK SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

Use the following checklist prior to uploading your document(s). <u>Only submit final files.</u> School Datebooks will not make changes or corrections to the documents.

- ☐ Is your page setup (page size, margins, and bleeds if applicable) correct based on book size? Using incorrect page setup may result in your handbook content not fitting as expected.
- We suggest exporting a print-ready PDF for submission. If you are uploading the native files, have you packaged your files to include all fonts, images, and additional files used?
- ☐ Do you have a Table of Contents? If so, have your page numbers been checked for accuracy?
- ☐ Has your school name changed and is this reflected throughout the document?
- ☐ Have you checked your document for spelling or grammatical errors?

☐ Do you have pages that will be torn out? If so, make sure that tear-out page is an odd-numbered page, followed by a blank, even-numbered page.

• If you include copyrighted material, be sure you have approval to use it.


PAGE SETUP FOR FULL COLOR SIGNATURE SERIES PRINT-READY HANDBOOK

- · If you have any items meant to bleed within your handbook, be sure your print-ready PDF is exported with .125" bleeds!


ADOBE INDESIGN

Handbooks that include bleed need to be set up in InDesign.


SMALL BOOK (5.5" x 8.5")

LARGE BOOK (8.5" x 11")






- · Microsoft Word is not compatible with bleeds. If you'd like to include content outside the margin guide, set up your book in Adobe InDesign.







MIDSIZE BOOK (6.625" x 9")


NOTE: After you enter 6.625, Microsoft Word will display 6.62. The full 6.625 is stored internally.

UNDERSTANDING BLEEDS

Books are not normally printed one page at a time, as on a desktop printer. Rather, mutiple pages are printed on very large sheets or rolls of paper, which are then trimmed to the exact book size after the fact. Since the paper may be slightly out of alignment when it's trimmed, it's necessary for any content that's intended to run all the way to the page edge in the finished book to actually be printed extending past the page edge; otherwise, there could be little slivers of white paper showing around the edges.

"Bleeds" is the printing jargon for the part of a design that's beyond the finished page edge.



Running the content all the way to the edge of the page looks good in InDesign...



but manufacturing limitations mean it might not look the same in the finished product.



To avoid this, extend your design beyond the page edge and export with 1/8" bleeds...



so the extra can get trimmed off after printing, ensuring the finished book will look right.

One of the challenging aspects of using bleeds in books is that the margins may not be the same all the way around. Our planners require a wider margin on the inside edge to leave room for the coil, as well as the hole punches for large or midsize books. This means that each page needs to be designed to fit either the right or left side of the spread; if it's placed on the wrong side, it won't fit:





Just like in any book, the first page will appear on the right side of the spread, so its wider inside margin will be on the left. The next page will be the opposite, and so on.



If you can't adjust your file to fit, or it's just not a priority, let your Account Manager know; we can add a white border instead.



CANVA

Canva is not an ideal choice for setting up your handbook as it is not designed for bound books, so it doesn't support the wider inside margin we need to make room for the coil and hole punches. If you'd like to use Canva, here's what you'll need to do to make a usable file:

Since it won't be possible to set up the wider inside margin, the best bet is to set up your file the page slightly wider, and use the wider margin dimension on both sides. Just keep in mind when you're placing graphics that a sliver is going to get cut off on the side away from the coil.


This can be a little confusing to keep track of, although it does have the advantage that you can design every page to work on either side of the spread, so it doesn't matter so much if you have to rearrange or add pages after the fact.





All of our product sizes will be custom page sizes in Canva. They all have slightly different proportions (especially small-size books) so make sure you're setting up your file to fit the product you've ordered--they are not interchangeable, and a design with bleeds has to be exact!

To set up the margins in your design, go to File > Settings. Canva's margins are the wrong width for our books and aren't adjustable, so keep "Show margins" turned off. Instead, add guides to show the actual margins:

Always keep "Show print bleed" turned on, and make sure the bleeds are included when you export your design to PDF.
